PRIMARY CARE – EMBEDDED MEMORY PROGRAM OVERVIEW

PURPOSE: TO SUPPORT FAMILY PHYSICIANS AND NURSE PRACTITIONERS IN THE ASSESSMENT OF MEMORY CONCERNS IN THEIR PATIENTS



UNIQUE ASPECTS:

- Family Physicians and Nurse Practitioners Coordinate
- Physically based on-Site at The Medical Centre FHO
- Team: RN Assessor (FHT) AND Client Support Coordinator (Alzheimer Society) 04
- Assessment: Cognitive Testing/Functional Assessment/Mental Health/Medication/EtOH/Driving/Care Giver Stress/Concerns
- Care Partner involvement from the outset with early connection to Alzheimer Society Client Support Coordinator
- Standardized referral process, assessment, documentation and follow-up



METHODOLOGY:


Survey: Retrospective Chart Physicians' and Nurse Survey: Review: Practitioners' Patient and Care Assessment of Knowledge, Attitudes Partner Experience Quality Indicators* and Practice (KAP) and Satisfaction related to Cohort Study Dementia Care

*Quality Indicators were developed from the ROSA Study as well as the 5th Canadian Consensus Conference on the Diagnosis and Treatment of Dementia.

PC-EMS: LESSONS LEARNED/FUTURE DIRECTIONS

Lessons Learned

- Primary Care Benefits from Team-based care can work well Roles need clearly definition and Team Members require appropriate training as geriatric assessors (cognition). A Comprehensive Assessment Integrating information from two or more assessors requires additional training as it is often a new skill.
- Improved accuracy and comprehensiveness of intake documentation improves improves efficiency and decreased time spent by Physicians and Nurse Practitioners on this task
- Family Physicians are interested in assessing and managing memory concerns in office settings, provided appropriate resources are in place. Standardized assessments and reporting provide consistent information for future specialist or team involvement.
- Collaborating with Community Agencies with common goals can lead to improved connections and care for patients with memory concerns and their families, and care partners.
- Care Partners Appreciate being involved and having their opinions valued.

Future Directions (Program and Community)

- Create a broader team internally in the FHO Involving other independent health practitioners (social workers and pharmacists)
- Funded and dedicated resources Extend to all FHOs Ensure Specialist programs receive correct referral and correct time.
- A COMMUNITY DEMENTIA CARE PLAN for BOTH DIAGNOSIS and POST DIAGNOSIS CARE next areas to pursue.
 Home Care and All Community agencies offering support post diagnosis
